

## Customary Drinking and Drug Use Record (CDDR)

BRIEF DESCRIPTION	The CDDR provides current (past 3 months) and lifetime measures of four alcohol- and other drug-related domains: level of involvement, withdrawal characteristics, psychological/behavioral dependence symptoms, and negative consequences.
